EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides assessment status of implemented projects for the department of Health, Sanitation and emergency services implemented from 2013-2017. The methodology used was desk review of relevant project administrative data; discussion and interview with senior management and staff of the department, field visits discussions/interviews with the project beneficiaries, brainstorming session and observation were carried out and interviews with key informants. The field findings of the assessed projects/programs indicated that most projects were still on-going, the completed projects were not in use, and all maternity wards were still ongoing; some dispensaries were complete but not operational. Key challenge realized was lack of supervision for quality works and implementation as per the bills of quantities. Recommendations discussed include completion of on-going projects, equipping and provision of staff for the completed projects also the department should co-operate with water department to prioritize water supply when constructing a new facility since water is key in daily operation of a facility.

INTRODUCTION

The Constitution of Kenya under the Bill of Rights, states that access to equitable healthcare is a right to every Kenyan. Good health is a prerequisite for enhanced economic growth and poverty reduction and a precursor to realization of the Vision's Social Goals.

The county invested heavily on infrastructure development of County Health Facilities. To establish the status of the implemented projects/programs, the county M&E unit conducted field assessment to monitor and evaluate sampled projects implemented by County government for health sector so as to determine their status, challenges and lessons learnt to improve and better service delivery within the sector. The field visit was conducted from November 2017 to December 2017

METHODOLOGY

The field monitoring and evaluation was participatory exercise which engaged officers from Health and sanitation and emergency service and M&E unit.

During assessment the following methodology was used for data collection and analysis:

- a) Desk review of relevant project administrative data;
- b) Discussion and interview with senior management and staff of the department
- c) Briefing and debriefing sessions with the department
- d) Field trips to selected projects to confirm and verify project progress in the field. During these field visits discussions/interviews with the project beneficiaries, brainstorming session and observation were carried out.
- e) Liaising and gathering information through meetings and interviews with key informants.

FINDINGS

The following were the findings for the visited projects implemented 2013 to 2017. The report contains summarized status of the projects capturing name of the projects, date of visit, ward, contractor, financial year, financial information, findings, recommendations and evidence through use of pictures.

- 4. Ensure water access as basic need for operation of facilities (Nasal dispensary was not operational due to lack of water)
- 5. Sustainability strategies and management of county health facilities should be developed for continuous service operations(payment of casuals, supply of drugs, emergency services)
- 6. The department to consider the completion and equipping of the numerous on-going projects.
- 7. There is need for guidelines for management and supervision of labor based projects
